

# Company Fact Sheet

## HISTORICAL TIMELINE

- » Cyanco was formed in 1990, as the result of a merger between Alta Gold and MSI Group.
- » The company's original purpose was to provide sodium cyanide in a 'ready-to-use' solution form to gold and silver mines throughout Nevada and the western United States
- » In 1992, Degussa (later renamed Evonik) acquired 50% interest in Cyanco.
- » In 2006, Oaktree Capital Group acquired Cyanco.
- » In 2018, Cyanco was acquired by Cerberus Capital Management.

## EXPANSION AND GROWTH

- » Over the years, Cyanco has expanded its distribution circuit to include customers in Canada, Mexico, South America and Africa.
- » In parallel, the company has grown production capacity by:
  - Commissioning a new solid cyanide manufacturing facility in Alvin, Texas
  - Expanding its solution production capacity at Winnemucca
  - Building a new solids plant at the Winnemucca facility

## CYANCO TODAY

- » Today, Cyanco has manufacturing operations in Winnemucca, Nevada and Houston, Texas, representing five independent sodium cyanide production lines.
- » Cyanco has product distribution terminals in:
  - Hermosillo, Sonora, Mexico
  - Cadillac, Quebec, Canada
  - Val d'or, Quebec, Canada
  - Cheyenne, Wyoming, US

## MANUFACTURING FACILITIES

- » About the Winnemucca, NV manufacturing facility:
  - Located on 1,280 acres near Winnemucca, Nevada
  - Independent production lines for solid and solution sodium cyanide
  - 24/7/365 production
- » About the Alvin, TX manufacturing facility
  - Production of solid briquettes began in 2012
  - Located near Houston, Texas
  - OSHA VPP Star Site/Responsible Care 14001 Certified
  - 42,113 Square footage
